From Ry Siggelkow - Book Conversation: Our book this fall is Dietrich Bonhoeffer's *Discipleship*. Bonhoeffer was a leading figure in the Confessing Church, a group of congregations across Germany that stood in opposition to the German Reich Church during the 1930s and 40s. Originally published in 1937, *Discipleship* is Bonhoeffer's most famous work and is widely considered a Christian classic. The next time we meet, **on Wednesday, Nov. 15 at 6:30 p.m.,** we will discuss **the chapter on The Sermon on the Mount.** We will gather at my house, and I will provide tea & cookies.
